Dear Parents, Teachers and Friends,

This weekend the boys and girls from Year 6 are receiving the sacrament of Confirmation, their final sacrament of initiation into the Catholic Church. If, like me, you want to know how things came to be, the following may interest you.

In the early Church the three Sacraments of initiation—Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—were celebrated in the same ceremony by adult catechumens at the Easter Vigil. The catechumens descended into a pool where they were baptized in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. They ascended, were clothed with a white robe, and the bishop laid hands on them and anointed them with oil. They then proceeded to a place of honour among the community where they participated in the Eucharist for the first time. Initiation thus consisted of one event with several moments. The climax was the celebration of the Eucharist.

The separation of the bishop's anointing from Baptism occurred for a number of reasons in the Western Church. Constantine's proclamation making Christianity the state religion in the fourth century meant that many more people were being baptized. Christianity also spread from the cities into the countryside. It became impossible for bishops, who were now also involved in governing, to preside at every Baptism. The bishops of the East solved the problem by delegating the Sacraments of Initiation to the presbyters, reserving for themselves only the blessing of the oil used in the rite. To this day the Eastern churches initiate with all three sacraments at once. The bishops of the West also delegated Baptism to priests, but retained the function of performing the initial anointing and laying on of hands. This they would do whenever they visited a particular locality. Thus, in the West the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation was done at a later time than the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism. We wish all the boys and girls from St Mary Star of the Sea all the very best this weekend as they welcome the Spirit in to their hearts through the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Saint Mary Mackillop Liturgy

Mary faced many challenges and hardship over her life time, including challenges from within the Catholic church, poverty and sickness. She faced all challenges with a trust in God, a spirit of service and a willingness to help others. When she was only 16 she noticed that the children living where she was in Penola, South Australia had little money and no opportunity for education, so Mary began to teach them. This inspired many others to follow her. This inspiration gave birth to the Sisters of St Joseph and even long after her death, her inspired work continued. Many schools in Australia have been started and continue to run this day because of Mary's and the Sisters of St. Josephs' efforts. In Australia, we have a lot to be thankful for because of St Mary Mackillop.

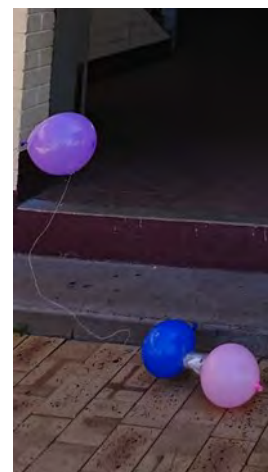

Middle School Science Update:

We have ignited our passion for science and hit the ground running this term. In the first three weeks the Year 10 students have successfully completed their first physics unit, taking part in two hands on learning tasks.



The first being a design task aimed at reducing the forces on an egg dropped from the Middle School balcony. The most successful design was created by Koby and Taj, pictured here implemented the features of air bags to absorb impact, and a strong frame to hold shape.



Although Jessica and Matilda's design showed promise after their focused design phase, their attempt ended with a broken yoke and thus were unsuccessful despite having included a number the key safety components.

In Week 3 we have finished our physics unit and have begun our studies of Chemistry. Just in the early phase of this unit we have now gained our Bunsen Burner licences which means we are capable of identifying and safely using this key piece of science equipment.



The year 7's who started the term learning about Chemistry received their certificates in Week 2 and we continue to utilise our skills as we progress into our examination of separation techniques. Year 9 students who are also working through Chemistry, will be the next year group to get their Bunsen Burner Licences as they move out of the Periodic Table and into a unit on Reactions, looking at combustion and corrosion.

The Year 8 students will get to Chemistry next term, at this point we are examining the human body. We have covered topics of cell biology, specialised cells, respiration, the respiratory, skeletal and circulatory systems. We will be doing a series of dissections this term including, hearts and kidneys which are sure to provide us with a great hands on experience with science.

That's all from the lab for now.
