The Aboriginal Mediation Service (AMS) provides a culturally appropriate option of conflict resolution services.

AMS aims to assist Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people resolve conflict before it escalates to violence or results in court action.

What is mediation?

Mediators involve people willingly engaged together to talk about their conflict and trying to reach an agreement that everyone can live with.

Mediation is facilitated by qualified mediators.

The mediators are a neutral third party who help the parties discuss the problems and explore solutions. Whilst the mediators facilitate the process, it is up to the parties to agree on solutions and make them work.

The Mediation Service is:

- Culturally appropriate
- Necessary
- Confidential
- Affordable
- Free

What types of conflict are suitable?

- Family (not family law)
- Sexual
- Community
- Neighbourhood

Benefits of using AMS:

- Culturally relevant services
- Confidential
- Necessary
- Free
- Affordable
- Qualified and experienced Mediators

When AMS can assist:

One of the parties to the conflict must be Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander. All of those involved need to be made aware that the conflict matter is being referred to AMS.

There must be a willingness from all parties to participate.

Every referral to AMS is assessed and suitability advised.

Who can make a referral?

Anyone can contact the AMS to discuss referral or conflict resolution services.
