FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Parents, Teachers and Friends,

Ash Wednesday begins next week. As it is the beginning of our Lenten period, it is interesting to look at church history and the Ash Wednesday tradition.

The biblical custom of repentance was to fast, wear sackcloth, sit in dust and ashes and to put them onto one's head. In the early church, Ash Wednesday marked the onset of a period of sober reflection, self-examination and spiritual redirection. At first, only public penitents – those who were guilty of serious misdemeanours – received the ashes. They were made to appear barefooted at the church and perform penances for their sins. Friends and family began to accompany them, perhaps in sympathy and in the knowledge that no person is free from sin; so gradually, the ashes were given to the whole congregation. The ashes are made by burning the left over palms from last year's Palm Sunday to give a sense of connectedness with those who have gone before us and shared the Christian tradition.

Lent is also a period where Christians are called to 'give up' or abstain from some of the pleasures of life as a means of sacrifice. Perhaps this Lent we might still do some of the 'giving up' things, such as no sugar in our coffee, but as mature Christians we should be able to look outside our own personal square and look for opportunities to be people of kindness, respect, dignity, comfort, love – true reflections of who we are called to be.

We will begin our Lenten period with an Ash Wednesday Mass in the school hall beginning 1:15 pm. Please feel free to join the school community for this liturgy.



As the season of Lent approaches, some people may groan and feel apprehensive at the thought of this period being something to painfully endure rather than an opportunity to deepen our relationship with Christ. Lent is more than just being ‘forced’ to give something up; it is a time for spiritual renewal and should be approached with joy. Instead of viewing it as a punishment or something very negative, we could try to look upon it as a blessing, to ‘accompany’ Jesus as he made his way to Jerusalem. Of course there were many obstacles and suffering along his way and we remember that were it not for his ultimate sacrifice for us all, we may never know His salvic love for all.

So for this Lenten season, try to take up the cross in sympathy with Jesus, so that in our own suffering and sacrifice, the rewards of a deeper relationship with Him is all the more sweeter.

On Tuesday next week, we will be enjoying our pancakes to mark the end of Ordinary time and to prepare for Lent. Please ensure that any food allergies are reported to your child’s teacher prior to the day. On Ash Wednesday, we will celebrate Mass at 1:20pm at our School Hall. As Ash Wednesday is one of the two days in which Catholics fast, each class will be having a shared lunch of bread and butter in their classroom. It will be an excellent opportunity to unpack our understanding of Catholic social teachings in which the simplicity of the lunch and the opportunity to donate to Caritas’ Project Compassion will help all students appreciate the world in which we live in and to consider the plight of others not as fortunate as we are and how we are able to practically help them. This is why Catholic social teachings focus so much on the preferential option for the poor. I attach more information about Project Compassion within this newsletter.

Please also note that on Ash Wednesday, our school canteen will only be offering fruit for sale at recess and standard lunches with no ‘frills’. Items such as biscuits, ice-creams, pastries etc. will not be available for sale at the canteen on that day. Students are welcome to bring their own lunches or to participate in bread and butter day with their class. Any donations towards Project Compassion will be greatly appreciated.

For over 110 years, Caritas has worked towards the creation of a just world. In 1964, Caritas began in Australia. A Catholic Agency for International Aid and Development, Caritas is Latin for love + compassion – two qualities which are central to their work.

CORONAVIRUS—update February 3

Dear Parent/carer

Acting on the latest information regarding the Novel Coronavirus from the Department of Health, Catholic Education Western Australia is advising the following for all Catholic schools in Western Australia.

Please note especially the advice relating to students travelling from or through Hong Kong which has recently been updated by the Department of Health.

Students who have been in the Hubei Province of China

Students who have been in the Hubei Province of China must be isolated in their home for 14 days after leaving the Hubei Province, other than for seeking individual medical care. They are not able to attend school, school events, day care centres or residential colleges. This also applies to parents/carers, staff, contractors, visitors and volunteers on school sites and at school events.

Students returning from mainland China (excluding Hubei Province of China)

Students arriving from (including transiting through) mainland China must be isolated in their home for 14 days from the time they leave mainland China. They are not able to attend school, school events, day care centres or residential colleges.

Students returning from Hong Kong (including transiting through) prior to 1 February

Students who returned from (including transiting through) Hong Kong prior to 1 February are being asked to stay at home for 14 days after leaving Hong Kong.

Students returning from Hong Kong (including transiting through) on or from 1 February

Students arriving from (including transiting through) Hong Kong on or from 1 February not displaying any symptoms may attend school. If they develop symptoms they should not attend school and immediately seek medical advice.

Students in close contact with a confirmed case

If a student has been informed by Public Health authorities they are a close contact of a confirmed case of the Novel Coronavirus, irrespective of whether they have developed symptoms, they cannot attend school, school events, day care centres or residential colleges until their local public health unit informs them that it is safe for them to do so. This also applies to parents/carers, staff, contractors, visitors and volunteers on school sites and at school events. Evidence from the public health authority is required for the student to return to school.

If your child will be away from school for the reasons outlined above, please contact the school to let us know when they were last in Hubei Province of China, mainland China or Hong Kong and to discuss any support for your child's learning while they are absent from school.

We will ensure that students' good standing is not impacted where they are absent through isolation as outlined above.

FEE CONCESSIONS FOR HOLDERS OF HEALTH CARE / PENSION CARDS

HEALTH CARE CARD FEE CONCESSIONS

Kindy to Year 12 Holders of Centrelink Health Care and Pension Cards may be eligible to receive Fee Discounts. The card must be current and show the names of the children attending school. The discount can only be given to the person responsible for payment of the school fees.

Holders must have one of the following cards:

- Pensioner Card—issued every two years on the cardholders birthday
- Most Health Care Cards—reissued automatically if eligible (usually valid for 1 year)
- Low Income Health Care Card—usually valid for 1 year and must be renewed each year

Parents of children who are in receipt of ABSTUDY are NOT eligible to receive HCC Fee concessions.

Department of Education Secondary Student Assistance

Parents of children in Years 7—12 who hold Health Care Card or Pension Cards are also eligible to receive assistance through the Dept of Education.

Applications for Secondary Assistance close on **FRIDAY 9th April 2020**. Claims cannot be made after this date. Parents of children who received ABSTUDY are eligible to receive a small rebate from this assistance scheme.

All families claiming fee discounts **MUST** complete new forms for 2020.

YOU MUST HAVE YOUR CARD WITH YOU WHEN YOU COME TO THE OFFICE TO COMPLETE PAPERWORK. Electronic form of the card is not acceptable as we are required to take a photocopy of your card.


Kiss and Drop
